**INAUGURATION OF CORD BHAWAN & SAMAJ SEVAK COURSE BY
PUJYA GURUJI:**

30th Nov 2009 was a glorious & memorable day for the vast audience of more than 15 thousand assembled in the Chinmaya Mission premises of Deuladiha in the presence of Pujya Guruji. Due to some unavoidable circumstances, Pujya Guruji arrived at the place a little late with Swami Sadanandaji & Swami Nigamanandaji from Deogarh. Guruji along with others were received with Purna Kumbha. The place was highly divinized by Sankirtan Mandalis with the chanting of Guru stotram. Among others Padmashree Dr Kshama Metre, National Director, CORD, Miss Mona Malian, coordinator,



CORD Head Office, New Delhi, Respected Trustees of Chinmaya Seva Trust, Rourkela, Acharyas of Chinmaya Mission Centers of Orissa, saints from different Hindu spiritual organizations, eminent personalities, Official Heads of Block & District Administration & Devotees were present to receive the great spiritual master.

The 'CORD BHAWAN' was inaugurated immediately by Pujya Guruji. In spite of his hectic visit to different Mission Canters in Odissa, Guruji was fresh & fragrant to meet the long waiting devotees without delay. The main platform was made beautifully amidst sal trees encircling the vast field in between, where thousands and thousands people from far and near welcomed Pujya Guruji with their traditional spiritual slogans and Harinam sankirtan. Pujya Guruji offered his salutation to Lord Shankar & Sri Hanumanji, the great Devotee of Sri Ram. Then Guruji lighted the lamp placed on the dais and flowered at the portrait of Pujya Gurudev and at the feet of Lord Jagannath. The inaugural programs on the dais were carried on, promptly with the direction of Pujya Guruji. Pujya Guruji was garlanded by Sri Saroj Kumar Pattnaik, an industrialist of Keonjhar and also the sponsor of 'the Samaj Sevak Course'.

Dr Kshama Metre, National Director, CORD, gave a brief speech on aim and objectives of the course in Oriya language which was highly appreciated by the audience. Among others Br. Somesh Chaitanya, the Project Co-ordinator, CORD, Deuladiha, Br. Sidhartha Chaitanyaji & Sri Ramesh Chandra Pradhan, executive secretary of CORD helped Guruji in different ways, for smooth management of the program. The inaugural



song was presented by Sri Debasish Jhara, a 10th standard student of Telkoi High School, Telkoi with his team. Guruji released 'the Samaj Sevak Course' Manuals before the vast audience. He delivered a short speech inspiring the public to arouse and to hold the responsibilities on their own shoulders to be elevated inwardly & to progress materially. Guruji distributed Chinmaya gifts to the land donors & honored Sri Saroj Kumar Pattnaik - the sponsor. The program was concluded by a stage dance by students of Saraswati Shisu Vidya Mandir, Telkoi. Though it was a short stage program the audience enjoyed it nicely. Prasad Sevan for all the devotees had been arranged with the public support. The program ended with a true success by the cordial participation of Chinmaya family, CORD staff and innumerable well wishers from different corners of the state. The administrative support for maintaining peace and security was ever appreciated. We invoke the grace and blessing of Gurudev for the great success of our effort and endeavor with His Vision.

THE SAMAJ SEVAK COURSE:

The noble idea of Pujya Guruji came true through the implantation of the Samaj Sevak Course CORD at Deuladiha on 30th Nov 2009. Eleven candidates from different corners of Odissa have been selected through interview to undergo this six months residential course. Sri Saroj Kumar Pattnaik, a leading industrialist of Kendujhar sponsored the amount for management of the course. From 1st of December 2009 the classes are being conducted by our National Director, Dr Ksahama Metre and with her team from Resource Centre, Sidhabari, Himachal Pradesh. The syllabus of the course has been prepared by herself with her long experience in Samaj Seva. With the consultation of Acharyas and other senior employees the classes are classified into different sessions co-relating both theory and practical.



The sevaks are the first of all the seekers of truth. So the morning and evening classes are managed to impart spiritual knowledge along with practices like Japa, Yoga, Meditation and Satsang. In between the seva oriented classes meant for the better livelihood of the community have been nicely arranged covering both theory and practical. So that the trainees can acquire both theoretical and practical knowledge immediately. It will enable the students to be independent in their practical fields to launch the CORD activities after the completion of the course. It is the positive aspect and the need of the hour to serve our motherland with the active participation of the people living in rural and tribal Odissa.

COMMUNITY BASED ORGANISATIONS

Self Help Groups:

10 new SHGs have been formed during the year 2009-10. Combined bank deposits is increased from Rs.872,776.00 to Rs.1,090,881.00, while loans availed to SHGs by banks is increased from Rs.44,55,000.00 to Rs.66,25,000.00 over last year and the groups have extended total internal lending of Rs.628,221.00 to members. Around three fourth of the total financial



assistance extended to all the households in the operational villages is through SHGs. Most of the important economic activities like agriculture, horticulture, goatery, poultry and small businesses are influenced by credits through SHGs in the project villages.

New accounting & book keeping system parallel to that of practised in Himachal Pradesh by CORD SHGs is introduced and adopted by most of our groups. Interloaning is introduced and adopted by most of the new SHGs formed during the year. Internal lending has also increased to encourage inflow of more credits to the members' households to spark economic prosperity in our project villages.

On Dt.04.03.2010 a Confidence Building Session on Introduction of New Accounting & Book Keeping was organized in the CORD Bhawan. Mr. Arvind Kumar and Smt. Kaushalyadevi and our Samaj Sevak Trainees explained to the Branch Manager of Bank of India, Telkoi Branch and 52 members / office bearers of 30 SHGs of Deuladiha GP. BM of BoI agreed to entertain the new system adopted by CORD SHGs & explained about different rules followed by BoI in bank linkage and sanction of loan to self help groups.

TENANT FARMERS' SELF HELP GROUPS (TFSHG):

After successful management of the first TFSHG formed in village Deuladiha two years ago, we were confident enough that lives of more and more numbers of landless agricultural wage laborers can be transformed through formation / efficient management of TFSHG in our project villages for tenant farming. We encased on it and formed one more new TFSHG comprising of 11 landless illiterate members from Munda community & one member from Mahanta community formed in village Shankarpur of SNPurgoda GP. One new TFSHG each in the villages of Golagadia (Bhimkand GP) and Ghuntuposi are planned to be formed during the first quarter of the coming year.

MAHILA MANDALS:

During the practical training sessions of the Samaj Sevaks in the field Chinmaya Udayagiri Mahila Mandal in Ward No. 7 & 8 of Udayagiri was dissolved to form two new mahila mandals - Chinmaya Santoshi Mahila Mandal (in Ward No.7) and Chinmaya Tarini Mahila Mandal (in Ward No. 8). Another new mahila mandal - Chinmaya Sri Jagannath Mahila Mandal also was formed by the Samaj Sevaks in Ghuntuposi (Ward No. 11). So total number of mahila mandals increased to 18.



During the practical training of the Samaj Sevaks the Aims & Objects and Rules & Regulations which were not in place earlier was incorporated in the minutes' book. Membership base increased from 598 households earlier to 722 during the period. Bank account has been opened by 13 out of 18 mahila mandals. Combined development fund out of membership contribution increased from Rs.30074.00 to 46908.00 during the period. They are actively involved in issues like anti-alcoholism, forest protection, cleanliness etc. while awareness programs on basic health, mother and child health, safe

motherhood and care is conducted through them. Brn. Swati Chaitanyaji and Dr. (Mrs.) S. B. Rath take spiritual awakening classes selectively very often.

Members of mahila mandals in the villages like Udaygiri, Santeibhanj, Jenadar & Golagadia play influential roles in the decision making in forest development programs under Orissa Forestry Sector Development Program (OFSDP). Chinmaya Bedamata Mahila Mandal of Madhyapur started taking up forest protection from this year. Awareness programs on government schemes & policies related to rural development are conducted through them.

YUVATI MANDALS:

After taking up women empowerment issues to some good form in our project villages, we got an opportunity to encourage self confidence well amongst adolescent girls during the Samaj Sevak training. As more trained staff are likely to be available shortly, 9 new_yuvati mandals were formed in 11 wards of Deuladiha GP involving 122 adolescent girls. On Dt.28.03.2010 an awareness program on Basic Health & Hygiene for Adolescent Girls was organized by the Samaj Sevak trainees under the guidance of Dr. S. B. Rath. 46 girls from different villages attended the program.



YOUTH CLUBS:



Three numbers of defunct youth clubs – two in village Deuladiha and one in village Santeibhanj were taken up for strengthening by the Samaj Sevak trainees. One in Deuladiha and the other in Santeibhanj can be revived. One new youth club was formed involving 30 youth in Mandeisahi (Ward No. 11) of village Nuagarh by one Samaj Sevak during the period.

FARMERS' CLUB:

Chinmaya Farmers' Club, Deuladiha sponsored by KCCB, Telkoi has been suffering from communal conflicts between the upper castes & dalits. It needs to be restructured and strengthened. Branch Manager of State Bank of India, Akul Branch is interested to sponsor one Farmers' Club in village Golagadia seeing our rapport with the farming community of the village and existence of CBOs.



KRISHAK SANGH:

Seven numbers of krishak sanghs were formed by the Samaj Sevak trainees involving 110 farmer members of 11 wards of Deuladiha GP. Members of Chinmaya Gopabandhu Krishak Sangh of Deuladiha took up Seed Village Program on Pulses (Rabi) and cultivated green gram in 5 acres.

GAON KALYAN SAMITI (GKS):

The office bearers of the Gaon Kalyan Samitis (GKS) were unable to use allotted funds in time for the purpose they were meant for due to lack of awareness and training. They even had no knowledge about the rules and regulations of GKS and monthly meeting of the executive committee was not held regularly. Capacity building program for strengthening of 6 GKSs of Deuladiha GP involving key members / office bearers was organized on Dt.28.12.2010 in the Anganwadi Centre (Saharsahi) of Deuladiha for the first time. Since then regular meeting of the executive body is generally held by date. Writing of monthly action plan on health wall has been started.

BASELINE SURVEY:

Baseline survey in all the five wards of the village as per the format attached herewith was conducted by the 11 Samaj Sevaks under training during the month of December 2009. It is noted that 11 out of 13 wards of the GP were thoroughly surveyed by the trainees. The survey covered the following useful household data apart from the basic amenities available in these wards:

1. Ward wise Basic Household Data
2. Ward wise Household Data on Livestock
3. Ward wise Land Use, Cropping Pattern & Production of Food Grains Data
4. Ward wise Household Data on Production & Consumption of Food Products
5. Ward wise Household Income & Expenditure Data

6. Ward wise Household Data on Assets & Entrepreneurship Potentials
7. Ward wise Household Data on Sources of Domestic Water / Consumption of Water & Fuel
8. Ward wise Household Data on Basic Health & Hygiene
9. Ward wise Household Data on Membership in CBOs & Debt

SURVEY ON EXTENT OF FINANCIAL INCLUSION:

As required by AGM, NABARD, Keonjhar vide letter number NB(KJR) / 135 / VDP / 2009-10 / Dated 9th of November 2009, a survey to estimate the extent of financial exclusion and a correct assessment of non-institutional indebtedness of families of the VDP village Deuladiha covering 445 households was conducted during the month of November 2009. A copy of the details about the survey is attached herewith.

NATURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

CHOWKA SYSTEM:

We had introduced chowka system – the dynamic system of soil & moisture conservation and fodder production during last financial year in one acre in village Deuladiha for the first time in Orissa state with technical support from our resource centre. On Dt.19.01.2010 & 20.01.2010, the second chowka system was also promoted in the cultivable waste land of Mr. Rohit Kumar Pradhan of village Deuladiha by the Samaj Sevak trainees in half acre during their practical training in the field.



TRENCH PIT SYSTEM:

Trench pit system in the mango orchard in the mission centre has demonstrated that the system not only can recharge ground water & help in soil conservation, but also can boost plant growth and productivity. Due to the contour trench in the eastern boundary and the trench pits under the 259 mango trees not even a single stream out of the 10 acres orchard of the mission centre has flown out through last two years. The Samaj Sevak were also trained here on trench pit system.

FARM POND FOR DROUGHT PROOFING UNDER MNREGS:



The elected members of Deuladiha GP wanted to keep the farm pond scheme under MNREGS for drought proofing secret. They wanted to extend the scheme benefits to their near and dear ones. They did not declare about the schedules of the palli sabha for

beneficiary selection for the purpose. As we came to know about it from reliable sources, we took the advantage of the presence of the Samaj Sevak trainees to help spread the message. Good numbers of applications were collected. The GP now has the opportunity to get more than 50 farm ponds sanctioned.

SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE

PLANTING MATERIAL BANK FOR ORGANIC TURMERIC:

Telkoi Block is famous for mango orchards supplying varieties of mangos to the different parts of India. The place underneath of each mango tree remains shady and vacant. It was thought by us to utilize the place under each tree by planting turmeric which will be an additional income to the land holder. As it is a tribal area the vision of the farmers is very narrow and olden. So for any new starting there must be a display and demonstration of the crops newly adopted.



So five quintals of turmeric was brought from the organization, KASAM of Kandhamal District of Orissa and same was planted under the shade of each mango tree of CORD premises. A few farmers got inspired to do the same from coming year. It is the opinion of the scientist of Horticulture department that in the presence of turmeric plants generally no snake will reside and rest adjacent of the mango tree and it also will prevent the growth of white ant which creates a great loss of the trees and plants. From coming year we are planning to promote the turmeric cultivation in different areas of Deuladiha village and Telkoi block wherever number of the mango trees are there by creating interest in farmers.

One of the farmers and also the land owner, Sri Krushna Chandra Sahu has planted 20 kgs of turmeric under his mango trees which have grown marvelously and become an example for others to adopt the process.

NURSERY OF RAUWOLFIA STARTED: In the first phase, the low cost nursery units in the mission centre and in SNPurgoda produced 5 and 200 numbers of Rauwolfia seedlings from stem cutting. Two beds – one each in the mission centre and SNPurgoda were shown with Rauwolfia seeds for the first time for raising of seedlings under the CLAP project through members of SHG groups after training.

VERMICOMPOSTING BIOTECHNOLOGY:

To reduce dependence upon use of inorganic inputs / chemical fertilizers and to promote of organic agriculture, production & promotion of organic inputs is highly essential. Earlier we had only 4 productive vermicompost units including one twin tank unit in the mission centre. During the practical training sessions,



Samaj Sevak trainees constructed 12 vermicompost units in 11 out of 13 wards of Deuladiha GP. Ideally planned and located, these units will have great demonstrative capability to promote vermicomposting and organic farming in the area.

POPULARIZATION OF PULSES (GRAM CULTIVATION) UNDER

ISOPOM:

Under Integrated Scheme for Oil Palm, Pulses, Oil Seeds and Maize (ISOPOM), promotion of cultivation of Pulses (Gram) was taken up in 10 acres in Deuladiha, 10 acres in Golagadia and 6 acres in Udaygiri with networking of CORD with agriculture department. Only 10 acres of demonstration plots were approved for village Golagadia in Bhimkand GP and Udaygiri in Deuladiha GP. However we achieved 26 acres of area under cultivation through mobilization of maximum beneficiary contribution in the 3 villages – Golagadia, Udaygiri and Deuladiha.

ORCHARD DEVELOPMENT UNDER NATIONAL HORTICULTURE

MISSION (NHM):



We found that mango & cashew orchards developed by government departments like DRDA, Horticulture & Soil Conservation in different villages of Telkoi block are generally not affected by movement of elephants while contributing well to the economic and environmental wellbeing of the farmers. So we took up promotion of plantation of mango & cashew in the most affected lands under Orchard Development Program of National Horticulture Mission.

With our active participation & collaboration with district horticulture department, 41 families from the villages of Deuladiha, Nuagarh, Golagadia, Kardangi and Saplanji took up cashew plantation in 61.4 acres and 39 families took up mango plantation in 80.7 acres. In total we have promoted mango & cashew plantation in 142.1 acres in our project villages.

SEED VILLAGE PROGRAM ON PULSES

(RABI) SPONSORED BY NABARD:

Targeted to promote cultivation of green gram (moong) in 12 hectares in the VDP village of Deuladiha, we could arrange only 200 kgs enough for 08 hectares. Due to absence of sufficient of water to promote the crop in 12 hectares, the program was not technically viable. On the other hand the village had no culture of cropping in Rabi due to that. In the mean time there was a class of interest between the upper caste and dalits. Under such circumstances upper caste farmers failed



to take up cultivation as per their commitment, where as 22 members of Chinmaya Gopabandhu Krishak Sangh of the village (all dalit members) cropped in 02 hectares. Due to poor capability of cropping in Rabi, they completed sowing in 28 days.

As the planting season was going to be over, we consulted AGM, NABARD to promote the crop in another two villages where there was more probability earlier. We promoted the crop in 02 hectares in Gaudunidar and 04 hectares in Golagadia. We have registered for 08 hectares of seed village for moong in Rabi for PDM 11 with Orissa Seed Certification Agency (OSCA). But unfortunately the above three villages unlike other area did not get a single shower after October 2009. And chances are there that the crop will fail.

AWARENESS ON ISM & H (INDIAN SYSTEM OF MEDICINES & HOMOEOPATHY):

To make health care accessible and affordable to the poorer, awareness programs on efficacy of homoeopathic medicines through some selected SHGs and mahila mandals in Nuagarh, Mandeisahi, Gaudunidar and SNPurgoda were conducted. During the year more and more patients are seeking health care through homoeopathy.

INCOME GENERATION ACTIVITIES

CULTIVATION OF MEDICINAL HERBS:

A completion report on Cultivation & Collection of Medicinal Herbs as an alternative means of livelihoods was submitted to PHDMA, GoO / World Bank. Under the project, medicinal herbs like Sadabahar & Sarpghandha were cultivated for enhancement of income of the beneficiaries.



COLLECTION OF MEDICINAL HERBS:

With revolving funds supports from the project on medicinal herbs precious herbs like Kutaj (Indrajaba), Kalmegh (Bhuin nimba), Nageswar etc. are collected from the forest fringe villages. Kutaj has emerged as the highest income generating wild herb of the area.

NTFP COLLECTION:

Most of our project villages are closer to forest and Telkoi block is tribal dominated, where livelihoods of majority of the households depend upon collection of non-timber forest produces. Collection of dry Sal leaves is one of them contributing for above six months of food and livelihood security in a year. This particular activity has emerged as one of the most beneficial livelihood option for most of the extreme poor households most of whom are tribals, dalits, landless and people below the poverty line. The activity has spread to benefit over 1200 households in 48 villages through 33 secondary collectors.

During the first phase of the current NTFP collection year 10,231,000 dry Sal leaf plates (pattals) have been collected and transported in 32 truck loads to fetch Rs.1,176,565.00 to the primary collectors. The activity has earned Rs.38, 400.00 of revenue in the form of royalty to the Department of Environment & Forests, Government of Orissa through issue of transit permit.

NETWORKING, COLLABORATION & PARTNERSHIP:

ORISSA FORESTRY SECTOR DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (OFSDP):

Being impressed by our standard of work in collection of NTFP especially in collection of dry Sal leaves, Chief of Telkoi Filed Management Unit (FMU)-cum-Range Officer requested us to extend services to the extremely inaccessible naxalite inflicted villages under OFSDP. He advised the VSS office bearers in villages like Sanklei, Nipinda, Purusottampur, Gopinathpur, Gurum etc. to cooperate us in collection of Dry Sal leaves. He also released revolving funds support to SHGs for the purpose.

Earlier neither traders nor transporters were ready to move in those villages. Now under the banner of Chinmaya Mission / CORD, they move without hesitation as market gets raw material and people earn livelihood security. Our relationship with the community leaders of these villages brings confidence back to them as we discuss about different schemes of the government for their upliftment, we share their problems and try to find out solutions. Instead of leaving the villages in the past, now they are coming back to the mainstream.

SOCIO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (SEDP):

During 2008-09, we had provided resource persons for training on Incense Stick making to members of selected SHGs and made arrangement for supply of raw materials from Mandesahi. This year also they have promoted collection of dry Sal leaves through SHG federation in Jharbeda and Namposi GPs of Anugul district.

Seeing the opportunity in value addition, during the last week of March 2010 they have provided 8 pressed leaf cup & plate machines for 8 SHGs in 4 villages. They have requested us to provide resource persons for training and support in technical trouble shooting and efficient marketing of the finished goods.

TRIBAL DEVELOPMENT COOPERATIVE CORPORATION (TDCC):

TDCC has expressed interest to work with us and encase on our relation with the odd 350 households of Juanga community (a primitive tribal group) and equivalent numbers of other tribal families. They have decided to work with us on tribal crafts in bamboo and woods to restore their falling culture while generating income. They are also interested to promote similar NTFP & wild herbs collected by us through their networks in the coming days.

SWINE FLU AWARENESS PROGRAM:

A two day swine flu aware flu awareness program was conducted in Sri Radha Krishna High School in the participation of students, teachers, villagers, and CORD staff. On the second day of the program an awareness rally had been arranged with a large participants going around the lanes of the village to be alert and vigilant regarding the disease with pla cards and slogans. A meeting was arranged in school field to aware the common mass assuring not to be feared by the disease, rather to take prevention and precautions disallowing the disease in village climate. Dr S.B Rath and other Archaryas took part in the program to aware the inhabitants regarding the disease, the cause, the means spreading and preventions etc.



HEALTH CAMPS:



Health problem is a commonest one among the rustic people due to illiteracy and ignorance. So CORD management looks after the health care of the people approaching for help and assistance. It is an integral part of the daily activity of CORD, Deuladiha to provide health service to the poor and helpless. During the year we conducted five numbers of health camps in tribal villages of Samanali, Godhuli, Vimakand, Jenadar and Nuagada, where more than one thousand patients availed free medicines and valuable medical advices for chronic diseases. It is the important means to provide helath service directly and immediately to the sufferings, which prepares a conducive platform to sustain other CORD activities involving more.

EDUCATION:|

The present scenario in the tribal Orissa is very harassing and tragic due to so many causes. The parents are not aware about the learning's of the children. The teachers are not well concerned regarding their teachings and the standard of the students the rural society doesn't brother for the educational status of the institutions. Some times the prevailing educational systems doesn't cope with the students of the poor families. The number of teachers is less as per the requirement of the students. So to speak the enter education system is going to be collapsed in many part of the districts. We are conducting moral classes and Geeta chanting practices in much educational institution but that doesn't meet the crisis. The time needs a revolutionary changed in present educational syllabus and the sociology of the educationists needs an evolutionary renovation on the grass root level for easy and smooth spreading of education in poor and tribal folks.



STUDENTS MEET:



On 24th March 2010, a Student Meet was organized in the premises of CORD. About 250 students, teachers, guardians and CORD staff and others took part in the auspicious occasion of Shree Ram Navami. The assembled were hinted upon the importance and relevance of traditional and religious

observances through rituals. The topic of discussion was on the 'Examination is a measuring rod to evaluate the personality of a student'. The view of the students on the topic was multifarious. The Acharyas guided the students in the discussion. A few students sang very nice devotional and patriotic songs to amaze the listeners. It is a rare opportunity to meet once in a year in the time of final examination of the students coming to Radha Krishna High School, Deuladiha. The occasion carries the message of Pujya Gurudev and Chinmaya Mission through the students to different remote areas of tribal district. At the conclusion Prasad sevan for all had been arranged.

COACHING CENTRE:

A few coaching centre at Sateibhanj, Jenadar, Samnali and Sarei are being conducted to improve the standard of the students on the primary level.

NCLP SCHOOL:

The duration of 3 years of NCLP School under CORD management is going to be completed in the 31st July 2010. If the government offers same opportunity to the organization to run a new NCLP School the management will consult with the higher authority regarding the matter.
